POSITION OVERVIEW

To advise, teach and counsel clients of the Alcohol/Drug Program in realizing the problem motivating them to promote healthy lifestyle changes to end the cycle of addiction in Ho-Chunk families.

PERFORMANCE-BASED JOB FUNCTIONS AND OBJECTIVES

- 1. Ensure and maintain daily, all patient information and records are accurate and recorded in the electronic health record per IHS/DHS 75 requirements upon consultation with clinical supervisor.
- 2. Ensure all patient treatment plans are reviewed every 30, 60, 90 days at monthly case reviews with psychologist consultant.
- 3. Assessments recommendations and other pertinent information completed upon admission and updated every 30, 60, 90 days at monthly case reviews with psychologist consultant.
- 4. Upon initial assessment with recommendations based off ASAM (evidence based treatment criteria); counselor will ensure services being provided will meet client needs per recommendation of psychologist consultant at monthly case reviews.
- 5. Provide aftercare services, ongoing treatment plans for each client & group therapy sessions based off the assessment & collaboration with patient, clinical supervisor/psychologist to ensure that the plan is tailored to patients individualized needs, on a daily basis.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

EDUCATION:

Must have high school diploma, HSED, GED.

ESSENTIALS:

- 1. Must be a licensed as Substance Abuse Counselor as required by Wisconsin Regulations and Licensing.
- 2. Must have a valid driver's license, dependable transportation and proper insurance.
- 3. Must promote a positive and healthy lifestyle.
- 4. Must attend and complete specialized education in Substance Use Disorder Counseling within a comprehensive program covering the content areas in core curriculum or in a degree program approved by the department in a field with an addiction emphasis or concentration.
- 5. Must successfully complete the ICRC counseling examination.

EXPERIENCE:

- 1. Provide documentation of completion of 4,000 supervised hours of patient counseling experience performing the 8 practice dimensions as a substance abuse counselor, within the past 5 years.
- 2. Provide verification that 2, 000 hours were in direct face-to-face substance abuse patient counseling.
- 3. Substance Abuse Counselor shall be provided two (2) hours of clinical supervision for every 40 hours of counseling to include one in-person meeting each calendar month.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES REQUIRED

- 1. Must have working knowledge of American Indian culture, values and traditions. Or, willingness to learn and understand.
- Must have good organizational skills.
- 3. Must be able to communicate clearly with clients, their families, community members, other professionals and other Ho-Chunk Nation staff.
- 4. Must maintain client confidentiality in accordance with Department Policy Privacy Act/HIPAA regulations.
- 5. Must be proficient with Microsoft programs.
